OUR STORY

Since 1999 a group of parents worked hard to build the first Catholic high school in the Coachella Valely. Xavier College Preparatory opened its doors to 48 freshmen in 2006. The student body reflects the socioeconomic and ethnic diversity of the Valley, and includes a vibrant community of international students. Xavier seeks to educate the whole person, and is rooted in the Jesuit tradition of forming men and women with and for others.

HONOR SOCIETY ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS (NHS, NAHS)

National Honor Society: Open to students in grades 11-12 with a minimum unweighted cumulative GPA of 3.7. National Art Honor Society: Open to students with an unweighted GPA of 4.0 in two or more visual arts classes.

HONORS & ADVANCED PLACEMENT COURSES

All course offerings are College Prep (CP) level courses unless designated Honors (H), Pre-Advanced Placement (Pre-AP) or Advanced Placement (AP). AP courses are not allowed freshman year. Two AP classes are allowed sophomore year; up to three are offered junior year; up to four senior year. All students who take an AP course at Xavier are required to take the AP exam for that course. Honors and AP courses each have course and minimum letter grade prerequisites. Up through and including 2021-2022, to be eligible for a course at the next level of rigor, a student must have had a grade of 'A-' or higher in the prerequisite course(s) in order to stay at the same level of rigor (H/AP); teacher approval was required. Pre-AP courses & Open Enrollment were launched in 2022-2023.

BASICS

Our new academic school year starts August 7, 2024 and runs until the last day of school, May 24, 2025. Classes begin at 8:00 AM and end at 2:40 PM. Xavier maintains a GPA letter-grade scale. For the 2024-2025 school year, Xavier continues to practice assigning grades to coursework. Xavier does not rank students.



Test Results

Many colleges and universities adopted a test-optional or test-blind policy for the 2022-2023 admission cycle. Given the varied background of our students, the dangers and unknowns of COVID-19 and its transmission, and the frustration and inequity around registering and sitting for tests, Xavier has counseled its students to use their best judgment about taking standardized tests this year. Since a significant percentage of our seniors will not have test scores to report, we have decided to eliminate test score ranges from this Profile because they provide at best an incomplete context for evaluating our students.

GPA Calculation

Only Courses taken at Xavier factor into the GPA Calculation. Non-Xavier courses taken for remedial purposes will appear on the Xavier transcript but will not factor into GPA calculation. The current highest GPA for six semesters at Xavier is 4.503 for the Class of 2025.

Remediation

Students have access to remediate a grade of D or F via in house programming. Successful completion of remediation courses results in a C-range grade (C+, C or C-).

Solidarity and Outreach

Xavier's Solidarity and Outreach programs develop our students to graduate as men and women with and for others. Xavier strives toeducate students with a focus on social justice while inviting them into relationship with the marginalized in our communities. In an effort to foster a spirit of intrinsically motivated service, Xavier has chosen not to quantify the number of hours a student "must" serve each year. Rather, students are "free to serve" in solidarity with our neighboring communities.

Academic Information

A total of 27 credits is necessary for graduation. A student is required to take seven courses per year.

Concurrent/Dual Enrollment

Students are not permitted to take a course at another institution if the same course is offered at Xavier. To enroll in a concurrent or dual enrollment course, students must have a GPA of 3.5 or higher and obtain administrative approval. Dual enrollment, which allows students to earn both high school and college credit, is optional and available only through Creighton University, Saint Louis University, or Rochester Institute of Technology, with an additional fee paid to the university. The course title displayed on the transcript will include "DuE," whether or not students choose to enroll for dual credit.

Visual and Performing Arts

Xavier students' work is represented in a number of competitions, exhibitions, and shows. Currently our students' accomplishments are part of the Scholastic's Art and Writing Awards - both in the Regional and National venues: the Palm Springs Art Museum Creativity and Scholarship and Awards Program, the National Jesuit 4x5 Art Exhibit, Vans Custom Culture Competition, and the Congressional Art Competition.
