There are players with autism, Down syndrome, spina bifida, deaf, blind, and some kids that have been through traumatic events in their lives. All of these families are in need of financial assistance and get to play for free. There is an hour game every Saturday for 10 weeks, beginning the first Saturday in October. Most of the players need help following the ball and running up and down the field. That is where our VIP Buddies come into play. We have youth volunteers that assist these players at every game.
