Snapshot: the big picture.

Designed for a phased buildout, the Master Plan is our roadmap to develop the campus. The intention is to meet both immediate and future requirements. When completed, the expansion will feature five main projects that accommodate a range of functions, beginning with urgently needed classrooms. From safety and smart design to wayfinding and circulation, our plans have been created to elevate the Xavier experience for everyone.

We have five proposed projects. Chief among them and our top priority is the proposed Great Hall. In addition, there are four more proposed facilities: Xavier Saints Stadium; Indoor Sports Complex; Chapel Building; Swim and Water Polo Complex.

The power of place.

Overall, the team has endeavored to incorporate the aspects of placemaking that strengthen community connections between people and spaces. Our architectural team has designed spaces that enhance health and well-being, campus identity, and a deep sense of belonging.

The premise is that bringing people together in thoughtfully designed spaces encourages collaboration, learning, and positive change. We'll invite interaction with everyone who learns, works, and serves on our campus, as well as with the local community. The interplay between the facilities is meant to welcome people in.

Proposed Great Hall

The heart of our campus.

The centerpiece of our expansion is our proposed Great Hall. The three-level multi-use building is strategically sited to be the heart of Xavier's campus. Much like a student union on a college campus, the 63,000 sq. ft.+ building will fulfill many essential functions. Just about every student will utilize the beautifully designed, flexible spaces during the course of each day, which is really the point.

Building additional classrooms has been top of mind for several years. The Great Hall's top level will provide 13 classrooms as well as a mezzanine area for students to socialize. Exterior balconies will accommodate campus events and offer space for viewing home games. There will also be quiet areas for study away from the distractions.



Culture and community: a physical expression.

Beyond the many important functions, the Great Hall will host and serve. The structure is a physical expression of Xavier's culture and community.

The main level will feature the Student Commons, our campus hub. A tapestry of activities will happen on the main level in highly adaptable spaces. Everything from planned meeting areas and impromptu gathering spots to administration offices and places to study.

Spaces to forge friendships, solve equations, share burdens, gather, celebrate, and bond.

The main dining hall and the kitchen are located here, designed to meet a range of dining and catering needs. The Great Hall main level will showcase Xavier's trophies and awards as well as its illustrious history.

The lower level's event center will host multiple occasions. Whether speaking engagements, plays, assemblies or mass, the many uses will be accommodated in a space that can seat approximately 500 people. This will be the venue for mass until The Chapel Building is completed.

Student-Focused Design Character

The exterior design complements the Early California Spanish influence established with our existing campus structures. The building will frame the inner Student Quad, an outdoor shared community space. Designed to promote social interaction and connection, this will be the main exterior activity space.

The Great Hall's crowning glory will be a tower near the main entrance, which will be a landmark. Intended to provide a visual reference for the Xavier campus, this architectural feature will indicate the main entry to The Great Hall.

Sustainability

We value sustainability and stewardship. Several years ago, we moved ahead of the curve to support our utility needs with renewable energy. Our on-site solar energy generation results in cost savings and carbon reduction as well as increased energy reliability. All of which become more critically important every year. Our solar operation will continue to help provide a significant percentage of our energy supply to meet campus utility demands.

From a building perspective, everything has been designed to reduce energy consumption and lower costs. This helps meet California's building code and environmental requirements, which require a high level of sustainability as a base for building design. Key aspects of our construction use high-efficiency glass, proven-performance insulation, state-of-the-art mechanical equipment, and other cost-saving measures.

To round out our built environment, we have four additional proposed innovative facilities, venues designed to complement our Great Hall and serve a multitude of functions.




Proposed Chapel
